Proposed amendments to
Metro Vision and the 2050
Metro Vision Regional
Transportation Plan

Background: The purpose of the public hearing was to receive and consider public testimony on cycle amendments to Metro Vision and the 2050 Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan. DRCOG staff proposed amendments to five projects, including adding four new projects and making one staging period change to an existing project. The draft amended Regional Transportation Plan has passed pollutant emission tests for regional air quality conformity and meets the state greenhouse gas emission reduction levels.

The proposed amendments to Metro Vision's performance measures and targets include updates to baselines and targets for housing and employment in high-risk areas based on new fire risk data from the Colorado State Forest Service. DRCOG staff also updated the baselines and targets for traffic fatalities to reflect the goals of Taking Action on Regional Vision Zero.

There were no public comments during the hearing.

Strategic informational briefing



Regional Transportation

Background: Davidson gave an update on RTD's financial outlook and highlighted recent successes and potential challenges ahead. Following the COVID-19 pandemic, RTD's mid-term financial outlook is strong. However, RTD's board of directors is concerned that the majority of the agency's revenue comes from a single source, sales and use tax, which is subject to consumer spending volatility. In addition, the exemption from the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (known as TABOR) RTD has had in place since 1999 is set to end in 2025, at which time approximately half of RTD's revenues will be subject to TABOR growth limits. Davidson reviewed mitigation options RTD's leadership is considering, including the possibility of seeking voter approval to extend RTD's TABOR exemption. He also highlighted a few of the agency's recent successes, including an updated and simplified fare structure and the one-year Zero Fare for Youth pilot.

<u>Discussion of the update to</u> <u>Taking Action on Regional</u> <u>Vision Zero</u>

Planning and Operations

Background: DRCOG staff drafted a strategic update to Taking Action on Regional Vision Zero to ensure its relevance and consistency with emerging best practices in transportation safety. The update adjusts the implementation plan with measurable goals, timelines and the stakeholders responsible for implementation, with the ultimate goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on the region's roadways. The updated plan also includes a new executive summary, a letter of commitment from DRCOG's executive director and revisions to safety countermeasures to bring them in line with the Federal Highway Administration's Proven Safety Countermeasures initiative.

A public comment period concluded on February 27, 2024. DRCOG staff reviewed feedback from member jurisdictions and the public and addressed it in the updated draft as the scope allowed. Comments not addressed in the most recent update have been noted for future updates. Staff have also been working to ensure the plan meets upcoming state accessibility requirements.

Result: The Board unanimously approved the update to Taking Action on Regional Vision Zero.



<u>Discussion of state</u> <u>legislative issues: new bills</u> for consideration and action
