Informational briefings

Ride Alliance

Malorie Miller from the Denver Regional Council of Governments, gave an overview of the region's Ride Alliance project, specifically highlighting the scope of the recently

awarded Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation stage one grant. The Ride Alliance project aims to build a trip exchange hub that eliminates silos and maximizes available resources, providing a one-stop-shop for folks looking for transportation to connect them to services that support a high quality of life. The project received a \$975,486 Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation grant in July 2024 to carry out stage one of the project, which will enhance, integrate and pilot the trip exchange hub.

Autonomous truck mounted attenuator for work zone safety

Gagan Masaun from the Colorado Department of Transportation, gave an overview of the state's autonomous truck mounted attenuator project, specifically highlighting the scope of the Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation stage one grant awarded in 2023. The project is designed to test autonomous vehicles that remove the driver from the maintenance truck, which minimizes operational risks, enhances efficiency and optimizes highway management. The current use case is on paint striping operations on lower volume state highways. This project is part of a multi-state effort that looks more broadly at the use cases for integrating autonomous truck mounted attenuators, assesses the versatility of the trucks and develops a toolkit for future implementation. The other states testing the technology are Minnesota, Oklahoma and Wisconsin departments of transportation.

Working Group leadership

Ms. Lindsey introduced Thomas Joyce from the Colorado Department of Transportation as the co-chair of the working group for the 2025 calendar year.

Partner agency updates and other matters

Ms. Lindsey asked if any participants on the call had updates. Lisa Nguyen from the Denver Airport announced a dynamic traveler information project at the airport and shared information about improved bicycle parking at the facility.
