Project Corridor

- Approximately six miles along Parker Road, between Mississippi and Hampden Avenues
- Colorado State Highway 83 (CO 83)
- Through and adjacent to:
 - Unincorporated Arapahoe County
 - ▼ City of Aurora
 - City and County of Denver
- Project funding (DRCOG TIP):
 - ▼ Federal
 - ▼ Arapahoe County
 - City of Aurora



Need for Improvements

Transportation improvements are needed to address:

Safety

JEWEL

- Vehicular and multimodal (crashes and safety concerns)
- Multimodal Connectivity
 - Pedestrian, bicyclist, and transit (focusing on key areas for community resources and enhanced connections)
- Multimodal Travel Experience
 - ▼ Feelings of comfort and safety, plus convenience

Project Goals

The goals of the recommended transportation projects are to:

- Minimize environmental impacts as practicable
- Maintain or improve vehicular traffic operations
- Proactively support adjacent development patterns
- Serve regional mobility and local accessibility for all modes
- Support local and regional planning efforts
- Utilize technology advances supporting a highly functional multimodal corridor
- Incorporate feedback received through public outreach
- Preserve economic viability of the corridor by minimizing impacts to businesses

Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)

Parker Road (CO 83) identified as a BRT corridor by multiple agencies (RTD, City and County of Denver, DRCOG)

- Future BRT along Speer/Leetsdale/Parker Road
 - **×** Downtown Denver (Civic Center Station) to Nine Mile Station
- A future BRT study will identify:
 - ▼ Operation of BRT
 - ▼ Stations
 - Costs and Next Steps

Project Prioritization & Timeframe

Recommended options were combined into 16 potential projects

12

- Projects assigned an overall priority (Higher, Medium, Less)
 - ▼ Purpose and Need and Goals
 - ▼ Timing and Effectiveness
- Potential timeframe for construction/implementation
 - **×** Focused on ease of implementation and cost

- Technology: CDOT Innovative Mobility, Charge Ahead Colorado

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


Shared Use Path - Mississippi to Peoria

 CDOT responsible
 for maintenance
 within state highway
 right-of-way in
 counties
- CDOT should be responsible for maintenance of shared use path in unincorporated Arapahoe County
 - Will need IGA prior to project construction





Mississippi Intersection Improvements



Dartmouth and Cornell Bike Lanes



Dayton to Iliff Improvements (Long-term)

- Intersection corner modifications, added left turn lane, signal improvements, raised median
- Northbound I-225 On Ramp Improvements (Long-term)
 - Added ramp lane to ramp meter, crossing improvements
- Hampden Off Ramp Pedestrian Improvements (Mid-term)
 - **K** Crossing improvements
- Dam and Vaughn Pedestrian Improvements (Short-term)
 - Intersection corner modifications
- Corridor EV Charging Stations (Mid-term)
 - Four locations: Florida, Havana, Dartmouth, Nine Mile Station


