The problem

- Inconsistent patchwork of local building codes, regulations, and processes.
- Costs and challenges for local governments of new code implementation and enforcement.
- Uncertainty regarding policy impacts and an evolving regulatory and legal landscape.







How we are going to solve the problem

 DRCOG and peer support for consistent policy adoption and implementation.

Financial support for participating jurisdictions.

 Research to address information gaps and misinformation.





Purpose of the BPC

- Drive healthy, efficient, and pollution-free new and existing buildings through ambitious and consistent building policies.
- Develop collaborative solutions to common implementation challenges.
- Lower energy cost burden for occupants over lifetime of buildings and equipment.
- Transform the Metro Denver market in combination with other grant elements.






- \$34.8 million in subawards to DRCOG's member governments.
 - Enable local government to implement, enforce, and collaborate on building decarbonization policies.
 - Direct staff capacity (internal or contracted) and other process and system support.
 - Avg \$600,000 over the next 4 years for all communities.
 - <u>2025 Goal</u> applications open this summer & first round of jurisdictional awards granted by fall.
- Recommended award format being developed by BPC working group
 - 3 community workshops held to date.
 - Questions being discussed funding distribution & eligible uses.

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Jurisdictional Support Program next steps

- March 17 BPC workshop to review of formula metrics, discussion of application process, reporting requirements, etc.
- March 24 Publish jurisdictional allocation packet for public comment.
- May Final jurisdictional allocation, requirements, and eligible uses draft review to oversight committee for review.
- June Oversight/Board approval of jurisdictional support program structure.
- July -> September Applications open and contracting begins.
- October local government begin using awards / hiring new staff.







- \$2.5 million contract for regional policy network facilitation.
 - Coordination, stakeholder engagement, attending community councils, preparing materials, maintaining databases, and composing proposals.
 - <u>2025 Goals</u> Jurisdictions endorse Policy Roadmap towards zero emissions buildings and identify policy priorities through 2030.
- Currently in vendor selection process for peer network facilitator.
 - Anticipated contracting this month.
 - BPC Peer Network planning with vendor starting April.
- Future BPC community workshops.
 - Focus on policy collaborative work April June.
 - Peer network launch fall 2025.





Policy goals



Potential Policies:

- Building Codes;
- Building Performance Standards;
- Emissions & Equipment Standards;
- Rental & Contractor Licensing;
- Permitting.



Research



- \$1 million budget for localized research.
 - Data gathering and analysis to support collaborative needs.
 - Initial research areas:
 - Costs, benefits, and equity impacts of strengthening local energy/emissions policies.
 - Building stock analysis.
 - Electrification baseline & grid capacity.
 - Electric-preferred policy effectiveness & unintended consequences.
 - 2025 Goal hire vendor, identify research questions, and initial research completed.
